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| The USA, Canada and Mexico are the largest 3 countries in the continent of North America. | The Atlantic Ocean lays to the East of North America and the Pacific Ocean lays to the West. |
| The capital city of the USA is Washington DC. | North America stretches across the four main climate zones of the world – polar, temperate, sub-tropics and tropical. |
| The landscape of North America is extremely varied – there are mountains, deserts, plains, glaciers, rainforests and waterfalls. | Challenge: The Rocky Mountains stretch approximately 3000 miles through Canada and the USA |

PSCHE: How do we manage risk in different places?

Learn how to recognise, predict, assess and manage risk in different situations
 Know how to keep safe in the local environment and less familiar locations
 Understand how people can be influenced by their peers' behaviour and by a desire for peer approval; how to manage this influence

 Know how to keep safe online, including managing requests for personal information and recognising what is appropriate to share or not share online

Understanding of the World

Geography:

WALT Locate some of the world's countries, focusing on those in North America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.
 WALT Understand the geographical similarities and differences through studying the physical and human geography of a region of the UK and a region in North America.
 WALT Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography – climate zones, mountains.
 WALT Describe and understand key aspects of human geography – types of land use, distribution of natural resources (water, minerals).
 WALT Use maps, atlases and globes to locate the countries and features studied.

Science:

Living things and their habitats

WALT Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.
 WALT Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.
 WALT Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, this half term children will be working on the following objectives from the Year 4 Success and Challenge cards:

I am able to read, write and convert between analogue **including clock faces using Roman Numerals and digital 12- and 24-hour clocks using am and pm.**

I am able to estimate, compare and calculate different measures, including money in pounds and pence.

I am able to convert between hours and minutes; minutes to seconds; years to months and weeks to days- **calculate time durations that pass through the hour.**

I am able to recognise and write decimal equivalents to $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ and of any number of tenths or hundredths.

 I am able to use inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech.
 I am able to plan my writing by using examples from other writers and looking at their use of sentence structure, words and grammar.
