Spoken Language:

Understanding of the World

HISTORY:

WALT Conduct research about Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots.
 WALT Discuss the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for control of England, to the time of Edward the Confessor.
Being Different and Equal
 WALT Understand key historical events, beyond living memory, that are significant nationally and globally.

GEOGRAPHY:

WALT Use maps, atlases, globes, and computer mapping to locate countries and describe the features studied.
 WALT Describe and understand types of settlement and land use.
 WALT Explain economic activity including trade links.
 WALT Describe the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals, and water.

SCIENCE: Electricity

WALT Identify common appliances that run on electricity.
 WALT Construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers.
 WALT Identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery.
 WALT Recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit.
 WALT Recognise common conductors and insulators, and associate metals with being good conductors.

Select, use and combine a variety of software, including internet services, on a range of digital devices to design and create a range of programs, systems and content that accomplish given goals, including collecting, analysing, evaluating and presenting data and information.
