I LOVE LONDON

Literacy

SPOKEN LANGUAGE

WALT: Speak clearly in front of an audience

Role play - act out a historical story- The Great Fire of London/Guy Fawkes

WALT: Retell a story out loud in front of others

Story telling activities in a group

READING

WALT: Become familiar with key stories, characters and events

Texts: The Queen's Hat – Steve Anthony, Katie in London – James Mayhew

WALT: Draw on knowledge of vocabulary to understand texts

WALT: Identify and explain key aspects of fiction and non-fiction text, such as characters, events, titles and information

WALT: Identify and explain the sequence of events in texts

WALT: Make inferences from the text

WALT: Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far

WRITING

WALT: Research different London landmarks - Tower of London, Buckingham Palace, St Paul's Cathedral, Big Ben, London Eye.

WALT: Use vocabulary First, Next, After, Then, Finally

WALT: Write instructions as a London Tour guide to give directions

WALT: Write simple sentences using capital letters and full stops

WALT: Use new vocabulary to describe character, setting and sequence of events

WALT: Write a letter to the Queen

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

WALT: Learn about our rules and expectations in school

Discuss the routines in school e.g. lining up, assemblies P.E. coat, pegs, washing hands etc.

WALT: Understand different ways we might belong somewhere

Discussions/ writing -How do I know I belong to my family? School? Class?

Circle time activities

WALT: Understand that we are all good at something

Circle time activities to discuss- How do I know I am good at it? Can we be good at everything?

WALT: Find ways to work for you on how to diffuse a situation. Learning calming down techniques

WALT: Use different sketching techniques

WALT: Understand how different styles of music might make us feel

GEOGRAPHY

WALT: Understand geographical similarities and differences between countries and capital cities in the UK

Name and locate the four countries within the UK and name the capital cities

Learn to recognise features on a map and create our own map

WALT: Use directional language such as North, South, East and West

WALT: Identify different London landmarks

HISTORY

WALT: Understand key historical events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally – Bonfire Night

WALT: identify the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievement – The Royal Family

SCIENCE

WALT: Distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made

WALT: Identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock

WALT: Describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials

WALT: Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties
