Expressive Art and Design

Art: Drawing

Develop knowledge of drawing techniques. Learn to create artistic effects using tone, texture, light and shadow.

Learn how to use hatching and cross-hatching techniques.

Show an awareness of space when drawing.

Music

Develop knowledge and understanding of the stories, origins, traditions, history and social context of the music they are listening to, singing and playing.

Listen to both recorded performances and live music.

Play and perform melodies following staff notation using a small range as a wholeclass or in small groups.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

PSHE: Relationships

How do we treat each other with respect?

Understand how people's behaviour affects themselves and others, including online

Know how to model being polite and courteous in different situations and recognise the respectful behaviour they should receive in return

Learn about the relationship between rights and responsibilities

Learn about the right to privacy and how to recognise when a confidence or secret should be kept or not agreed to and when to tell (e.g. if someone is being upset or hurt)

Know the rights that children have and why it is important to protect these

Know that everyone should feel included, respected and not discriminated against; how to respond if they witness or experience exclusion, disrespect or discrimination

Learn how to respond to aggressive or inappropriate behaviour (including online and unwanted physical contact)

Know how to report concerns
Understand that treating a person differently because they are a boy or a girl is known as gender discrimination

Understand how to show their respect for diversity

R.E.: Belonging and Identity

Know that there are a number of religions in the world to which people belong

Know that there are different symbols to represent different religions

Understand that believers have different ways of showing they belong to a religion

Know that religions have different ways of welcoming people into communities, for example Christian baptism

Dance
