Gymnastics

Show basic control and coordination when travelling and when remaining still

Repeat the sequences with some accuracy and consistency

Objectives: Geography focus

Understanding of the World

GEOGRAPHY: Physical geography

Name and locate the world's seven continents.

Identify the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator

Understand the geographical similarities and differences through studying the physical and human geography of a small area of the UK and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country (Amazon rainforest and UK woodland)

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: forest, hill, mountain, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather

Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the continents and the location of the Amazon Rainforest

SCIENCE: Living Things and their habitats

Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.

Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats.

Computing: I-Safe

To understand what personal information means, know that it is unique to me and should only be given to a trusted adult.

To begin to identify the characteristics of people who are trustworthy and can help me and know that not everyone is trustworthy that we meet.

To identify a risky situation and when a trusted adults help may be needed.

To understand that emotions can be a tool to help judge unsafe situations and to know what this feels like

To understand the importance of checking with an adults before participating in an online environment

Expressive Art and Design

Art: Drawing

Explore different drawing techniques – lines, shape, shading, patterns.

Use different surfaces to draw on.

Draw with different materials – pencils, felt tips, chalk, crayons, charcoal, pastels

Music (Steps 1 and 2)

To maintain and perform a steady pulse using actions

To copy, respond to and play rhythmic and melodic patterns

To recognise and describe the features of music: tempo, mood, timbre and pitch

To control dynamics, when singing and playing instruments – to respond to a conductor

To explore rests in music
