

Knowledge Outcomes

- Planets in our solar system, including the Earth, orbit around the Sun.
- The Moon orbits the Earth, completing a full orbit every 28 days.
- The Sun, Earth and Moon are spherical in shape due to the gravity pull.
- The rotation of the Earth on its axis causes us to experience day and night cycles, with the Sun appearing to move across the sky.
- The changing position of the Moon around the Earth causes different visible phases.
- The tilt of the Earth as it rotates and wobbles on its axis causes us to experience different seasons.
- Mae Jemison was the first Black woman in space and carried out scientific investigations
