Confident to speak in a familiar group, will talk about their ideas, and will choose the resources they need for their chosen activities.

Can describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities. Say when they do or don't need help.

Managing feelings and behaviour

Talk about how they and others show feelings.

Communities

Know about similarities and differences between themselves and others Treasure box of personal things important to them (food, toys, places)

Explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.

Look at characteristics of liquids and solids

Floating and sinking - experiments... being a scientist

Moving

Initiates new combinations of movement and gesture in order to express and respond to feelings, ideas and experiences

Jumps off an object and lands appropriately

Show an understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges

Children taught to transport and store outdoor/PE equipment safely

Weekly PE session focusing on developing a range of skills

Fine Motor - handling

Uses scissors to cut around a simple shape.

Demonstrates good fine motor control and coordination Holds a pencil and (holds and) uses it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed
