To hear and write the initial and end sounds in words.

To explore different types of writing, shopping lists, cards, letters, labels etc.

Mathematics

Numbers

Recognises numerals of personal significance.
Recognises numerals from 1-5 and beyond.
Count up to 3 or 4 objects by saying one number name for each item.

Count out up to 6 objects from a larger group Estimate how many objects they can see and check by counting.

Use language or 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of natural objects.

Find the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them.

Say the number that is one more than a given number.

Begin to use mathematical names for 2D and 3D shapes
