Literacy

Spoken Language:

WALT Participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role-play, improvisations and debates
WALT Speak audibly and fluently with increasing command of Standard English
WALT Listen and respond appropriately to adults and their peers
WALT Ask relevant questions to extend their understanding and knowledge
WALT Maintain attention and participate actively in collaborative conversations staying on topic and initiating and responding to comments

Reading:

WALT Check that the text makes sense to them as they read and correct inaccurate reading
WALT Become very familiar with key stories, fairy stories and traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics

WALT Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far
WALT Listen to and discuss a wide range of poems, stories, and non-fiction at a level beyond that at which they can read independently

WALT Explain clearly their understanding of what is read to them

WALT Recognise and join in with predictable phrases
WALT Discuss word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known

WALT Draw on what they already know or on background information and vocabulary provided by the teacher

Writing:

WALT Say out loud what they are going to write about
WALT Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense

WALT Join words and join clauses using 'and'
WALT Sequence sentences to form short narratives

WALT Compose a sentence orally before writing it
WALT Discuss what they have written with other pupils
WALT Form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
