Spoken Language

WALT Give well-structured descriptions, explanations and narratives for different purposes

WALT Use spoken language to develop understanding through speculating, hypothesising, imagining and exploring ideas

WALT Participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role play, improvisations and debates WALT Maintain attention and participate actively in collaborative conversations

Reading

WALT Continue to apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words until automatic decoding has become embedded and reading is fluent

WALT Read accurately by blending the sounds in words that contain the graphemes taught so far, especially recognising alternative sounds for graphemes

WALT Read accurately words of two or more syllables that contain the same graphemes as above

WALT Discuss the sequence of events in books and how items of information are related

WALT Become increasingly familiar with and retelling a wider range of stories, fairy stories and traditional tales WALT Discuss and clarify the meanings of words, linking new meanings to known vocabulary

Multi-skills

Understanding of the World

GEOGRAPHY: Physical geography

WALT Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles

WALT Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather

SCIENCE: Living Things and their habitats

WALT Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. WALT Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

WALT Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

WALT Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats.

Computing: Online

WALT Talk about websites they have been on.

WALT Explore a website by clicking on the arrows, menus and hyperlinks.

WALT Recognise an email address. Find the @ key on the keyboard. Contribute to a class email.

WALT Open and select to reply to an email as a class.

Expressive Art and Design

Design and Technology

WALT Start to generate ideas by drawing on their own and other people's experiences.

WALT Begin to develop their design ideas through discussion, observation, drawing and modelling.

WALT Identify a purpose for what they intend to design and make. WALT Understand how to identify a target group for what they intend WALT To design and make based on a design criteria.

WALT Develop their ideas through talk and drawings and label parts. WALT Make templates and mock ups of their ideas in card and paper or using ICT.

Music:
