# **Knowledge Outcomes**

The Greeks developed governments and organised their citizens according to a constitution or a set of laws called 'The Great Empire'.

The Olympics began in Olympia over 2,700 years ago. It was originally a celebration in honour of the God Zeus.

There were 12 Greek Gods and Goddesses. A myth is a traditional story – Theseus and the Minotaur is an example of a Greek myth.

Challenge: The Greek Gods and Goddesses were Zeus (God of sky), Poseidon (God of sea), Athena (Goddesses of wisdom, war and useful arts) and Aphrodite (Goddess of love and beauty).

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

#### **PSCHE: What are families like?**
