Expressive Art and Design

Art: Drawing

WALT develop knowledge of drawing techniques.

WALT create artistic effects using tone, texture, light and shadow.

WALT how to use hatching and cross-hatching techniques.

WALT develop knowledge and understanding of the stories, origins, traditions, history and social context of the music they are listening to, singing and playing.

PSHE: Relationships

How do we treat each other with respect?

WALT understand how people's behaviour affects themselves and others, including online

WALT know how to model being polite and courteous in different situations and recognise the respectful behaviour they should receive in return

WALT learn about the relationship between rights and responsibilities

WALT learn about the right to privacy and how to recognise when a confidence or secret should be kept or not agreed to and when to tell (e.g. if someone is being upset or hurt) WALT know the rights that children have and why it is important to protect these

WALT know that everyone should feel included, respected and not discriminated against; how to respond if they witness or experience exclusion, disrespect or discrimination WALT learn how to respond to aggressive or inappropriate behaviour (including online and unwanted physical contact) WALT know how to report concerns

WALT understand that treating a person differently because they are a boy or a girl is known as gender discrimination WALT understand how to show their respect for diversity

R.E.: Belonging and Identity

WALT know that there are a number of religions in the world to which people belong

WALT know that there are different symbols to represent different religions

WALT understand that believers have different ways of showing they belong to a religion

WALT know that religions have different ways of welcoming people into communities, for example Christian baptism
