Welcome to the Spring edition of **Leading by Example** – your termly newsletter from the Head Boy and Girl Team.

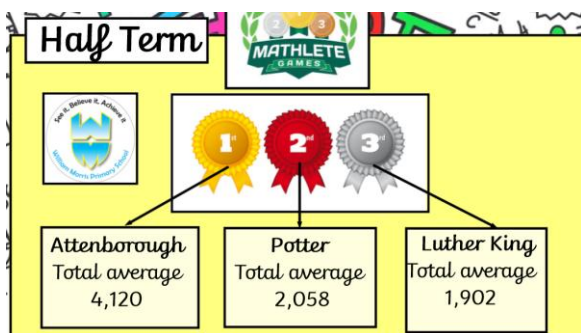
It has been another busy term at William Morris – take a look at what our hard work has achieved!
