Headlines and Summary

- There are currently 31 pupil premium children in Years 1-6, representing 6% of children in these year groups overall.
- In some year groups, the progress and attainment of pupil premium children is in line with non-pupil premium children, however in other year groups there is a progress and attainment gap.
- Typically there is a smaller difference between pupil premium children and non-pupil premium children making at least 1+ steps of progress.
- Where gaps exist, they are more significant in children attaining ARE than making similar progress.
- There are no significant trends in either progress or attainment between the three core subjects.

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| Year 1 | Pupil premium children typically perform as well as or exceed non-pupil premium children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics when making 1+ steps and 2+ steps of progress and have a similar percentage achieving ARE, with the exception of one pupil premium child in Oval class. |
| Year 2 | In Monument class, pupil premium children typically perform as well as or exceed non-pupil premium children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics when making 1+ steps and 2+ steps of progress and have a greater percentage achieving ARE. In Victoria class, pupil premium children typically perform as well as or exceed non-pupil premium children in Reading and Mathematics when making 1+ steps, however the percentage of them achieving ARE is significantly lower. |
| Year 3 | In Wimbledon class, pupil premium children typically perform as well as or exceed non-pupil premium children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics when making 1+ steps however the percentage of them achieving ARE is significantly lower. In Southwark class, non-pupil premium children make considerably greater progress and achieve ARE than pupil premium children in all subjects. |



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| Year 4 | In Euston class, non-pupil premium children make considerably greater progress and achieve ARE than pupil premium children in all subjects. In Piccadilly class, pupil premium children typically perform as well as or exceed non-pupil premium children in Reading and Writing when making 1+ steps of progress and when making 2+ steps of progress in Mathematics. Similar percentages of pupil premium children achieve ARE in all subjects. |
| Year 5 | In Barbican class, pupil premium children typically perform similarly to non-pupil premium children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics in terms of both progress and attainment. |
| Year 6 | In Westminster class, pupil premium children typically make as much progress as non-pupil premium children in Reading, Writing and Mathematics and at times exceed them. Pupil premium children attain similar or higher levels of ARE in writing and Mathematics, but less in reading. |

Target areas:

- Increase the number of pupil premium children in Years 2, 3 achieving ARE in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.
- Increase the number of pupil premium children in Euston class (now Barbican) making at least 2 steps of progress in all subjects.
- Increase the number of pupil premium children achieving three steps of progress across all year groups.

Actions for this academic year 2016-2017

Performance management pupil progress targets to support the acceleration of pupil premium children in writing and Mathematics to enable them to ensure attainment is more in line with the non-pupil premium children.

Provision mapping and support for identified SEN (pupil premium children) to support 3 to 4 steps of progress in reading and writing.





A review of our timetabling to ensure that sentence structure/grammar is taught discretely and as part of the project genre planning on a daily basis.

A whole school review of reading material to engage and inspire our pupil premium children to be confident writers.
