Barriers to future attainment In-school barriers (issues to be addressed in school, such as poor oral language skills)

The impact of Covid-19 on children's attendance and attainment. Many of our disadvantaged children have been impacted by partial school closures to a greater extent than for other children. Although not a significant concern in such a disrupted period of two years, attendance for disadvantaged pupils was slightly lower than non-pupil premium peers.

Internal assessment and observations of children indicates under-developed oral language skills and vocabulary gaps among disadvantaged groups.

Ongoing monitoring of the access and use of the Google Classroom reflects the challenges for families in accessing home learning opportunities confidently.

Internal assessments indicate that there is a gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium children making accelerated progress in Mathematics.

External barriers (issues which also require action outside school, such as low attendance rates)

Ability of parents being able to support their children's learning at home (home language/long work hours/understanding of present curriculum)

Mobility of families

In-year admissions: Pupil Premium children often join as in-year admissions. They are often below ARE on entry to the school.
